Case History Questions

The preliminary case history is essential in order to discover the grounds on which your case will be studied. Please understand that a simple YES or NO will not be enough in most of the cases. We kindly ask that you explain your answers.

With the information you have provided, we will draft an official Petition. In some cases, the Tribunal Personnel will contact the other party before the petition is accepted to see if he/she wants to participate in the process. Depending on the participation of the other party, the tribunal will decide what course of action and what procedure will be used on your case.

	our case history should contain the following information in not more than four pages. An interview, should u agree to participate, will provide an opportunity for further clarification of the questions.
1.	Before the marriage: When did you meet? How old were you? How long was the courtship? Did any behaviour turn up before the marriage that became a problem later on?
2.	Was there any external pressures to marry? Did anybody advise against the marriage? If so, why?
3.	Who proposed? Were you both happy about getting married? Did you follow a marriage preparation program? Why did you and your spouse decide to get married? Did either of you have doubts about the decision to marry?
4.	Consider your family history and that of your ex-spouse. Was it happy home life? Were you given good moral and religious example? Where there drugs, alcohol or any kind of abuse? How far did you go in school? How old were you when you first left home? For what reason did you leave home? How many are in your family? Where are you placed?

5.	At the time of marriage, what did you think about Church teaching about marriage? At the time of the marriage, were you both practicing Catholics?
6.	Was your wedding day happy? If not, why not? Did anything outstanding happen that day that you remember more vividly than other events of the day? Did you have a honeymoon?
7.	When was the marriage consummated?
8.	What constituted the happy times in your early marriage? How long were you happy?
9.	What was the earliest serious problem in your marriage? When did this occur? Describe this problem as well as you can.
10.	Did you have children? Did you both want children? Did you agree to this before marriage?

11. How was your communication? Did either one dominate the marriage? How did you manage financially?	
12. Was there any drinking? Drugs? Criminal record? Infidelity? (Before or after the Wedding?)	
13. Did you live up to your religious beliefs? Did you go to church as a couple?
