He also served as Dean of the Faculty and as Editor-in-Chief of *Theoforum*, the Faculty's peer-reviewed journal. His book The Sunday Lectionary: Ritual Word, Paschal Shape now appears as well in French, Italian, and Spanish editions. He regularly engages in weekend ministry at local parishes.
